My first bike was a 1969 Daytona that I purchased from Shaft's when I was either 18 or 19 and taught myself to ride. It was bit of a shitter but I did love it. I had to use two hands to pull the clutch lever in so I only rode that bike up and down our long metal driveway in first gear until the battery went flat as the charging system was not working either! The front brake also didn't work, which probably was a blessing when I was practising on the metal driveway. After getting everything fixed, I then ventured out in the big wide world and would "put put" around whenever I could.



I then met my future husband Syd, who dare I say it actually owned a Harley at that stage after many years of owing Triumphs. Syd introduced me to Tridents, himself having owned a couple previously. Also around that time a particular Club had moved to Waihi and rode through Paeroa quite regularly on their Tridents. You could hear them coming 5 minutes before they hit town, and man, that triple sound was something to get excited about. I really had to have one!

A little while later I sold my little Daytona to a friend in Wairoa. I was by that stage riding around on the Harley as Syd had lost his licence. The Harley was eventually sold and we had no bikes and were about to get married.

We started looking for bikes again after we were married, my hankering for a Trident was still there. We purchased a really nice Bonneville Special from a friend and then a hunt began for the Trident. After scouring the Auto Trader magazine, we found one in Huntly. It was quite interesting when we got the ownership papers, the bike was originally sold to Gisborne and Syd knew several of its previous owners. Syd has since met the very first owner of this bike, who is a member of TOMCC. He told Syd he saw the person he sold it to, riding it around an off road track! Go figure?



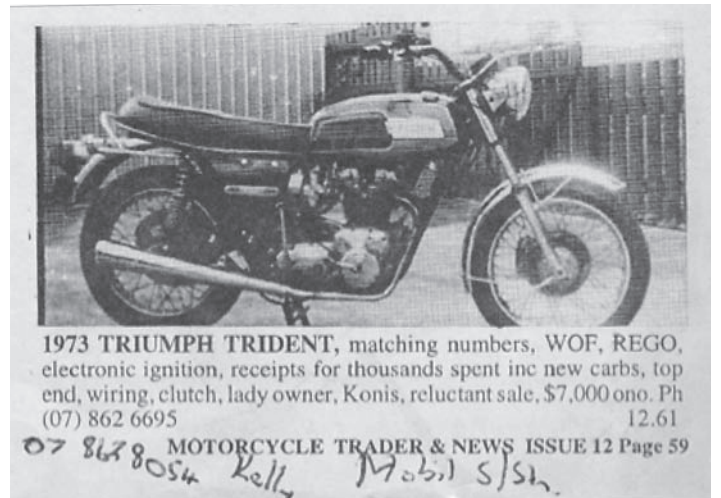
We took the bike down to Gisborne for my brother-in-law Mike to have a tinker with it. It was pulled down and put back together and I could finally ride it. I loved riding that bike, I rode it everywhere, even just the 2 minute ride to work, which also meant I could ride it at lunch time. I got a bit of stick earlier in the piece about starting it on the stand, so I soon learnt to start it whilst standing.

Anyway, by this time, the new Triumph Thunderbirds had come out and really liked the look of them. I decided to sell the Trident and purchase a Thunderbird. The Trident was sold to a guy in Rotorua and that was almost the end of the story!



As the years went by, the regret of selling the Trident crept in, and I used to say to Syd "if that bike comes up for sale again, we should buy it".

Christmas 2020 rolls around, it was a quiet day at home and I was actually starting to get a little pissed off as I hadn't been given a present! Anyway late afternoon rolls around and Syd said we need to go to his work to pick up my Christmas present, but have to go via a friends place first. This particular friend had just also purchased another T150v, so he took me out to the shed to see it. Well there was another one there also, which kinda looked familiar. Well f\*%K me and Happy Christmas to me. Syd had purchased it back from the guy we sold it to 22 years earlier! It looked exactly the same (other than the bars), he had only done about 5000 miles since owning it and he had all the receipts we gave him originally, together with the advert from the Auto Trader Magazine.



It is certainly nice to have in back in the stables at home. It sounds grouse! It needs bit of a tidy up and some TLC, so it will be heading up to DG Service to have a birthday. Come 2022 I will be out and about on it, and getting used to the gear change and brake on the "other side."

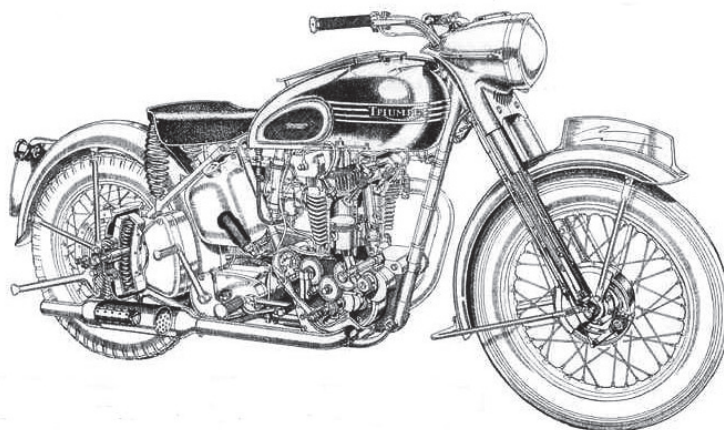
## Triumph Times archive

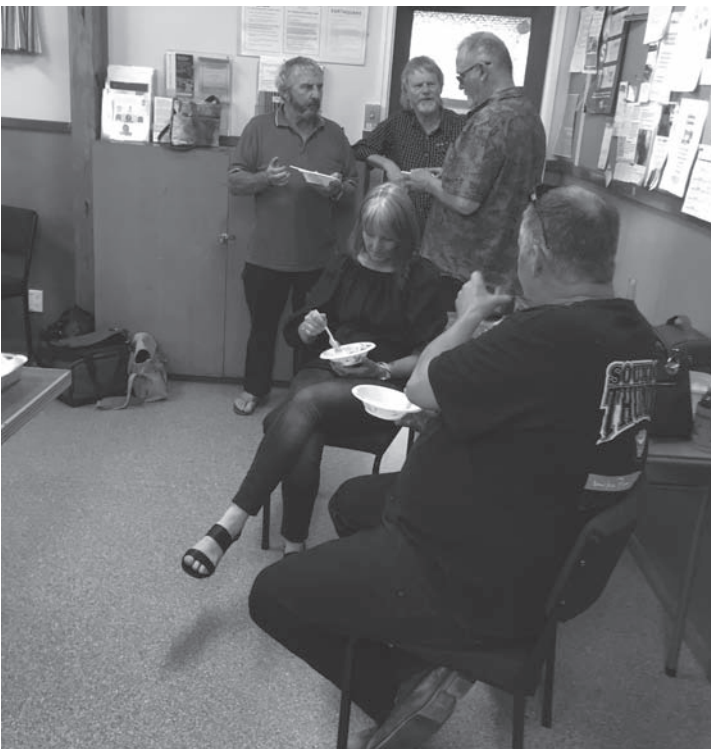

## AGM Minutes

### Saturday 19 February 2021, 9.37am, Clark's Beach Holiday Park

**President** John Witherington chaired the meeting

**Apologies:** Glenn Mills, Roy Maddox, Chris Martin, Bill Riddell, Peter Morgan, Bill Meadows, Maurice McTeigue

**Minutes of the last meeting:** Read by John Witherington. Moved by Wayne Woodward (195) and seconded by Arthur Bond (Bondy) (123) and passed as a true and correct record by all in attendance. Matters arising from previous minutes: Nil

#### Presidents Report

John Witherington presented the below report

- At and from the last AGM 2021 an objection to the Treasurer's Report was placed by John Milligan (Canterbury Member), that the report do not meet the requirements of the Incorporated Society. Trevor Lau (Canterbury Member), an accountant in conjunction with John Milligan came up with the new reporting system and presented it to the Treasurer so we can meet our obligations to provide accurate recording of all income, expenditure and assets belonging to members of the Society that being all financial members of TOMCC NZ Inc and to meet the IRD returns. (see Treasurer's Report).
- During the year a member of the TOMCC NZ national body proposed to raise the annual membership renewal from \$25 to \$30 dollars. A vote on the proposal under Rule 18 was held within the TOMCC NZ national body and passed. This is the second time ever that there has been a rise in the membership fee with the first going from \$20 to \$25 dollars a very long time ago.
- As an example only, and not getting into specific scenarios, as an incorporated society we need to be able to cover unexpected losses, eg bar licence fines, venue and equipment hire, damages etc.
- On the subject of membership renewals, another reminder, should you not renew your membership on time you may forfeit your continuous membership thus missing out on being awarded continuous membership 10, 15, 20, 25 years awards.
- Membership renewals will now be spread out over 2 months June/July to make the TOMCC NZ Inc membership secretary's job a bit easier.
- National Poker Run – Glenn Mills (Auckland) and Life Member came up with the idea for the TOMCC NZ Inc National Poker Run, with proceeds going to assist the next area hosting the National Rally.
- The original poker run earned \$500 of which \$170 was used as prize money. The balance was passed on to the Otago/Southland area to go to hosting the 2021 rally. Upon completion of that rally the Otago/Southland chapter returned the balance of \$330 plus adding to it to round it off to \$500, to assist the following year's Poker Run and area hosting the rally. It is hoped this can continue going forward to successive rallies.

#### Treasurers Report

Melissa Shipp presented the below report

- A new financial reporting year has been passed with the new year being 1<sup>st</sup> November to 31<sup>st</sup> October. This set of accounts however spans the dates of 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021; due to the previous set of accounts dated 2020 finishing 31<sup>st</sup> December 2020.
- We have now moved to an online software programme, MYOB, the cost of this is \$46.00 per month. I have spent some considerable time setting up all the accounts to report both National and Area funds in and out.
- Profit and Loss; although the overall Loss of \$11,266.63 is reflected at the bottom of the page, this shows that we are using the money for our members to encourage fellowship and promote our club.
- Balance Sheet; total equity in the club is **\$70,473.49**, made up of money in the bank, regalia on hand and assets.
- Thanks to Trevor Lau for his wisdom and guidance in achieving the structure we have now.
- Thanks also to the area persons who have liaised with me so I can incorporate your income and expenses. This now provides a clear and concise picture of how financially we all are as an Incorporated Society as per their reporting standards.
- I would like to move that these financial reports be adopted and passed as a true and correct record.
- Passed Wayne Woodward (195) and seconded by Graham Ovenden (270) and passed as a true and correct record by all in attendance.

#### Editors Report

Ken Spall presented his report, noted that the later half of the year was better with receiving more information from area's to fill up the *Triumph Times*.

#### General Business

- Membership renewals will now be split over June and July to allow for easier processing by Rik the new membership secretary
- John explained that you must have continuous membership in order to qualify for the year badges
- John reminded everyone that although area's are making their own regalia, there is a lot held in National stocks, and asked the question "do we continue selling it?". John will be raising this issue again through the *Triumph Times*, and asking for feedback. Clive Barrow has stood down as Regalia Office due to work commitments, but John advised that there is someone else who may be interested in the role. He asked if anyone in attendance would like to take on the position, no one offered to do so
- Tim Fraser (Wanganui co-ordinator) asked, do we have the ability to offer members who cannot attend the AGM a virtual platform to join online. John responded that currently the Rule Book does not allow this, but if someone were to write a remit in the correct format and allow for voting on it, this is possible. He offered to help anyone who wanted to create a remit as it is a very lengthy involved project, as it may need to reflect on other rules we currently have.
- Canterbury remit on selling of assets, (as per December *Triumph Times*) – this did not pass the vote. It can be resubmitted with an explanation.
- Wayne Woodward asked the question, can we get an online joining form uploaded to the website. He explained many other clubs do this, and the ease of completing it online vs printing off and completing a form may put someone off as it seems too hard (antiquated). This will be looked at by the National Body to come up with a solution.

## AGM Minutes – continued

- Trevor Stapp mentioned that using the generic search engines online seems to promote other motorcycle clubs over TOMCC NZ. The National Body will look at ways to achieve a better result.
- John suggested again that areas who do not use their Facebook/Social Media pages to shut them down as it is not a good look to see areas who have not updated anything in months
- Ken Spall outlined an area co-ordinator's role, it is not up to one person to arrange everything, he also mentioned there are a number of areas that are lacking a co-ordinator and asked for members to have a think about taking on the role
- Bondy spoke about the upcoming meeting in Hawkes Bay to form another area, a lot of positive encouragement was said
- John explained that some current area names do not represent geographically the regions they cover, perhaps we may need to redefine some area names
- Next year's rally – no area has expressed an interest to hold as yet
- Bondy spoke about the reason we are all members; here to ride bikes, communicate with other area's, have fun and be tolerant

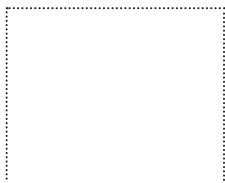
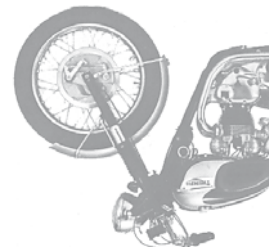
