

Use it or lose it?

For the last couple of years or so there has been a significant decline in club regalia sales to members, with a particularly large drop in total sales this year.

- 2023/24 174 items compared to 2024/25 85 items
- The men's & women's Ts are now a very slow mover; do we stop supplying these items or do we need a change?
- The stickers remain our biggest selling items along with our various cloth patches and various hats.
- Everything else has been under 10 item sales per year!
- Moving forward do we only stock non clothing items?
- Do we only sell various clothing items on a pre ordered basis?
- Do we need other items to sell?
- · Or do we stop selling regalia all together?



The question for you, our members is, do you still want a club regalia selection? If so, then it is up to you to purchase items and support our regalia range – **use it or lose it.**

We know that some Chapters are organising their own regalia, in spite of us as a club having an agreement not to do so. This doesn't help the situation of declining regalia sales. In addition, sales of other clothing at our rallies also aggravates this.

Our regalia is still one of the easiest and best ways to promote our club nationwide, and we should vote to retain it. However, based on the above data and future discussions, at this stage we're unsure what it would look like in the future.

This topic is sure to be raised at our AGM next year, so in the meantime please consider what you want to do regarding club regalia availability.

Saturday morning I headed down to McIver and Veitch for a look around their store. They certainly had plenty of Triumph's in stock and merchandise. A quick pop into see Ken and then it was on to Gore, which is not only the home to Country Music, but also seems to be the home of Chrysler Valiants! I haven't seen so many in years.

A quick reconnaissance of the site at Mandeville and it was onto Forest Lodge in Tapanui for the night. Great cheap accommodation super friendly publican even had a live band playing my kind of music.

I left early on Sunday and headed back to Mandeville. I

I spent a couple of hours looking at the bikes. All the English bikes were displayed together, the other makes parked separately. There were plenty of Triumph twins and triples of all ages what a

fantastic turnout (I'm told this was helped by the weather). I met another four TSS owners, with two TSS bikes in attendance. I also caught up with the Southland Otago members

attending the show. The show was all over by 2.00 pm, so I began my trip North again. I headed to the Top 10 Holiday Park in Geraldine. This place was recommended by Dr Pat and Liz, and was an excellent facility.



I took a tour of the Military Museum the next morning which I didn't know existed, and is well worth a look if that interests you.

The plan was to stay in Cheviot but the motor camp there was booked out. By now the great weather I had been having was on the way out. I had been battling strong winds and knew rain was coming, so I decided to carry on to Blenheim.

Before heading to Picton the following day, I made the trip out to the Pelorus Tavern at Canvastown where the publican has some great English bike memorabilia on the walls. Also there is a fantastic poster of Anna Kornakova in the toilet for all you tennis fans out there.

My quiet and well apointed cabin at the Waikawa Bay motor camp was my bed for the night. It is a great place to stay and a short walk to the Jolly Roger Restaurant which puts on a great feed.



The morning sailing was rough but I was glad to get back to the North Island as they cancelled the sailings for the rest of the day. The ride out of Wellington was pretty bad as well, but the rain stopped by the time I got to Masterton.



Around 2600 kms completed and the Bonneville didn't miss a beat apart from mysteriously cracking a mirror. I'm also getting it right as far as not taking too much gear. All items I took being used except for a hat. I did purchase a \$6.00 jacket from an SPCA op shop when I was feeling the cold at one point.

If you haven't been before and you do get a chance to attend, I thoroughly recommend it.

TIM'S TRIUMPHS A Legacy of Passion and Restoration

Long serving East Coast member Tim's history with Triumph's started at the age of 15 when he purchased a 51 Sprung Hub. This was a major step up from the two BSA motorcycles previously owned.

Tim's collection of Triumph motorcycles tells a story of passion, restoration, and a knack for finding bikes. Below are the current Triumphs owned by Tim, listed from oldest to newest.



1954 150cc Terrier: Purchased from Trade Me eight years ago and remains in its original condition.



1969 Bonneville: Bought in Hawke's Bay twelve years ago as a complete bike with a blown engine. The engine has since been fully reconditioned.



1967 Trophy: Bought as a basket case in 1981. After a 17 month restoration, this bike has won multiple categories at bike shows over the years and features a personalised plate.



1977 Bonneville: Purchased in 1980 with just 7,000 km on the clock and front-end damage after the previous owner hit a kerb at speed.



1968 Bonneville: Acquired in pieces. Tim purchased the engine in Wellington and, some time later, found the matching frame in Hawke's Bay. The restoration took seven months complete with K70 tyres.



2018 Bobber: Purchased with front-end damage. Tim spent seven weeks getting it back on the road. The biggest delay was waiting for new fork tubes to arrive from the UK. Initially, Tim considered selling this bike due to discomfort with the seating, but a recently arrived spring seat kit from Australia may change his mind.



2008 Rocket Three: Also bought with accident damage and subsequently repaired by Tim.



2020 Rocket Three GT: Bought new from Courtesy Triumph and features another great personalised plate.



2021 1200 RS: Acquired accident-damaged and restored by Tim. This bike will be for sale soon, as the riding position does not appeal to him.

Each of these motorcycles reflects Tim's dedication to the Triumph brand and his impressive skills in restoration and repair.

Highlights from Tim's Triumph Journey

Favourite Triumph Owned – With such a wide range of ages and technologies represented, it's not easy to compare, but the '67 Trophy and the 2020 Rocket stand out as Tim's favourites.

Least Favourite - Tim once owned an early Speedmaster, but found it didn't suit him.

Accidents – Fortunately, Tim's riding history has been mostly incident free. He did come off a Saint he owned as a young man on loose gravel, but nothing major resulted.

Missed Opportunity – Tim was once offered an English-spec Royal Wedding Triumph that the owner had only ridden to and from their own wedding. Unfortunately, funds weren't available at the time.

Interestingly, Tim has never owned a T150 or T160.
